2016 REPLAY QUIZ #14

- 1. 3/5 @ B-20. The Field Judge rules A14's pass to A86 in the end zone complete for a touchdown; however, the Line Judge flagged A86 for Illegal Touching. Replays show that A86:
 - a. stepped out of bounds on his own at the B-1 and was the first to touch the pass inbounds.

Confirm the ruling on the field. The touching and foul are reviewable (12-3-2-b and 12-3-8-e). The penalty is loss of down at the previous spot (7-3-4), and the clock will start on the snap because of the touchdown (3-3-2-c). A - 4/5 @ B-20 - Snap.

b. leapt from out of bounds at the B-1 to touch the pass.

No need to stop the game as both the ruling on the field (Illegal Touching) and the actual result (incomplete pass per 2-27-15-a-2, 4-2-3-a, and 7-3-7-a) will result in A - 4/5 @ B-20 - Snap. The clock starts on the snap whether this is an incomplete pass or a touchdown negated by Illegal Touching.

c. leapt from out of bounds at the B-1 to touch the pass. Also, B79 was in the neutral zone at the snap.

Reverse to an incomplete pass, after which Team A will accept the penalty for B79's foul. The result will be A - 1/10 @ B-15 - Snap. Without a foul by Team B, a stop would not change a thing, but here it changes the ruling on the field (Offsetting Fouls -- A - 3/5 @ B-20 - Snap) to a new series for Team A.

- 2. 2/15 @ B-45. Quarterback A7 scrambles, and the Referee rules that his knee contacts the ground with the ball in his possession at the A-45. Replays show that prior to his knee contacting the ground, A7:
 - a. fumbled the ball, and that in the immediate continuing action, B93 recovered the loose ball at the A-47.

Reverse to a fumble with clear recovery in the immediate continuing action (12-3-3-d-2). As the clock would have remained running under the initial ruling, reset the clock to the time of B93's recovery. The result will be B - 1/10 @ A-47 - Snap.

b. fumbled the ball, and that in the immediate continuing action, A68 recovered the loose ball at the A-47.

No need to stop the game as there is no direct competitive impact by allowing the ruling on the field (Runner Down -- A - 3/25 @ A-45 - Ready) to stand in favor of the correct ruling (Fumble with Clear Recovery in the Immediate Continuing Action -- A - 3/23 @ A-47 - Ready). As a matter of fact, if time were of the essence, stopping the game and the clock at this point could put one team at an advantage.

c. threw a forward pass that fell incomplete in the vicinity of eligible receiver A86.

Not reviewable. The errant ruling of A - 3/25 @ A-45 - Ready will stand. While a ruling of runner down when in fact the ball was <u>fumbled</u> is reviewable, the same is not true if the ball was actually <u>passed</u>. While this is anecdotally correct, an additional case play is needed to clarify this as non-reviewable.

- 3. 1/10 @ A-30. Quarterback A12 scrambles, and the Referee rules that he steps out of bounds with the ball in his possession at the A-20 with 4:56 remaining in the 2nd quarter. Replays show that prior to his foot contacting the sideline, A12:
 - a. fumbled the ball at the A-20, and in the immediate continuing action, B79 recovered the loose ball at the A-25.

Reverse to a fumble with clear recovery in the immediate continuing action (12-3-3-d-2). If the clock was restarted prior to Replay notifying the officials of the review, it will need to be reset. In any case, the result will be B - 1/10 @ A-25 - Snap.

b. fumbled the ball at the A-20, and in the immediate continuing action, the ball rolled out of bounds at the A-25.

No need to stop the game as both the ruling on the field (runner out of bounds at the A-25) and the actual result (forward fumble out of bounds, returned to the spot of the fumble per 7-2-4-b-1) will result in A - 2/20 @ A-20 - Ready. The clock starts on the ready whether this is a runner out of bounds (3-3-2-e-3) or a forward fumble out of bounds (3-3-2-e-2).

c. threw a forward pass that fell incomplete in the vicinity of eligible receiver A86.

Not reviewable. The errant ruling of A - 2/20 @ A-20 - Ready will stand. While a ruling of runner out of bounds when in fact the ball was <u>fumbled</u> is reviewable, the same is not true if the ball was actually <u>passed</u>. This is clear from 12-3-3-g, but an additional case play to clarify this would be a nice touch.
